

A SIMPLE WILL  
made easy

This is a straightforward will for people who want to leave everything to one person, most often a partner or spouse.

It's designed for simple situations, with no complex arrangements.

You'll be guided step by step, and at the end we'll create a clear version of your will for you to review, print, and sign.

### *Before you begin*

This guide will help you create your will by answering a few simple questions.

You don't need any legal knowledge — we'll explain anything that might feel unfamiliar and guide you through each step.

Your answers will be used to create a draft of your will, which you can review in full before downloading or printing.

Nothing becomes official until you print it and sign it in front of witnesses.

### *Do I need a solicitor?*

Not for a simple will like this - as long as it is signed correctly and witnessed, it is legally valid.

If your situation is more complex, or you'd prefer legal advice, you may choose to speak to a solicitor, but it isn't required for this type of will.

### *What if I change my mind?*

You can update or replace this will at any time.  
Only the most recent, properly signed version will apply.

### *Keeping your will safe*

Once your will is signed and witnessed, it's important to keep it somewhere safe and easy to find.

You can find more information about storing your will, to make sure the people you trust know where it is and can access the most up-to-date version when needed.
